







Map 7 : WeBS mean peak count: Cormorant




### Map 8: WeBS mean peak count: Curlew







#### Map 10 : WeBS mean peak count: Dunlin






Map 14: WeBS mean peak count: Knot







### Map 16 : WeBS mean peak count: Mallard









#### Map 19 : WeBS mean peak count: Redshank






## Map 23: WeBS mean peak count: Teal


### Map 24 : WeBS mean peak count: Whimbrel




### Map 25: WeBS mean peak count: Wigeon




### Map 26: Formal & Informal car parking within or near the Humber SPA




### Map 27: Drive-time isochrones around all car parks



















## Map 37: Questionnaire results: Mean frequency of walking and dog walking in WeBS sectors



























## Map 47: Questionnaire results: Frequency of water-based activities in WeBS sectors










## Map 51: Questionnaire results: Frequency of airborne activities in WeBS sectors
