



AIRCRAFT PILOTS

Help us protect birds on the Humber estuary at Read's Island, Blacktoft Sands and Alkborough Flats. These sites are west of the Humber Bridge.

Avocets, bittern and marsh harriers, which are legally protected from disturbance, breed in this area from 1 March to 31 July.

Over 100,000 wading birds use the Humber mudflats throughout the year. Low-flying causes birds to take flight, posing the risk of bird strike.

To avoid both disturbing these protected birds and the danger of bird strikes, please ensure you do not fly below 500 feet in this area of the estuary. Thank you
